The Haiti Teach a Child Foundation is a non-profit Foundation founded in 2014 by a group of dynamic and helpful young people acting in a spirit of love, patriotism and sacrifice to enable Haitian families to improve their living conditions especially Orphan vulnerable children and to live in dignity.

VISION

The HTCF work is a society that facilitates the integration of all children without exclusion through quality education.

MISSION

The HTCF's mission is to change the future of children and communities living in poverty through education. To this end, it provides services to communities living in conditions of extreme vulnerability in the fields of education, health, the environment, peace promotion, Art, culture, gender and social inclusion.

PASS PROJECTS

"Train to Change, Change to Transform" is a project implemented by the Haiti Teach a Child Foundation (HTCF) aimed at combating violence and crime in the commune of Cité-Soleil from November 2022 to April 2023.

The purpose of this project was to train forty (40) young girls and young mothers aged 15 to 25 in: leadership, non-violence awareness, entrepreneurship and cooking and pastry-making for 6 months. **Donors: OAS/PADF/INL**

SUMMER MUSIC CAMP

"Integration of vulnerable children through music" is a summer camp project aimed at combating juvenile delinquency in the precarious neighborhoods of Port-au-Prince. This project enabled more than 120 young girls and boys aged 10 to 20 to learn a musical instrument: trumpets, sax, clarinets, flute..., followed by training in sexual and reproductive health, awareness-raising against sexual violence and psychosocial support. **Donor: Taiwan Embassy.**

CURRENT PROJECT 1/3

The HTCF has established a music school since July 2021, to contribute to the reduction of violence and juvenile delinquency in Haiti by helping vulnerable orphan children.

CURRENT PROJECT 1/3 | SUCCES HISTORY

I'm Béanca TOUSSAINT, motherless, I joined the HTCF music school in July 2021 when I was 13, and today, November 7, 2023, I'm 15 yrs. I am passionate and motivated to learn music. I am very grateful to the HTCF for allowing me to take part in this music school free of charge. The management of my classical school established a music class training and I informed them that I am a musician. They gave me several exams and I passed them all. They hire me as teacher I am now earning about Fifteen Thousand Gourdes (15,000.00) or One Hundred and Ten (110 USD) per month, an amount that has helped me to take care of my business. I would like HTCF to continue this noble work in order to change the lives of orphan vulnerable teenagers and young girls like me. I would like to continue perfecting my musical skills and become a great musician.

CURRENT PROJECT 2/3

Since its creation, HTCF has provided significant support to vulnerable orphans by helping them to attend school. The foundation currently supports over 268 children 119 g and 149 b, all of whom are children in vulnerable situations in the Kenscoff locality. And more than a dozen young people are also helped to continue their post-secondary studies.

CURRENT PROJECT 3/3

Every end of year, the Foundation brings joy to children whose parents are unable to provide them with gifts by distributing toys for Christmas.

- The foundation plans to build a classical and vocational school to benefit children in the Grand 'Anse department, which was hit by a devastating earthquake on August 14, 2021.
- Open music school in Kenscoff / Pagesse
- Cultural Exchange
- Create a Social Reinsertion Center to strengthen the life skills of orphans' vulnerable who are susceptible to get involved in criminality activities aged between 10 and 15 .
- Construction of 30 latrines and the installation of an artesian well for the benefit of inhabitants living in the community of Pagesse, located in the commune of Boucan Carré, in the Centre department.
